

VISITOR TIPS

Dogs on 6-foot leashes are permitted in the State Parks. Always clean up after your pet.

Many species of birds, including the endangered Florida Scrub Jay, live and nest along the corridor and the beaches. Watch and enjoy their beauty, but avoid disturbing nesting birds. When adults leave the nests, eggs and hatchlings are open to predation.

Dunes are the first line of defense for beach preservation. Always use the designated walk-over to access the beach. Human foot traffic on the dune damages the fragile grasses which hold the dunes in place and disturbs the wildlife living on the dune. Help to educate your children to dig and play on the flat beach, not on or under the dunes.

Several species of sea turtles nest on Volusia Co. beaches. You can help the eggs to hatch by avoiding nests which the Turtle Patrol has marked with bright yellow tape and a sign.
